Health Canada has determined that the recalled products do not meet the *Corded Window Coverings Regulations* and pose a strangulation hazard. Young children may pull looped cords around their neck, or become entangled in the cords, causing a strangulation hazard and even death. In addition, the products can also release small parts that present a choking hazard to young children.

Health Canada recommends cordless window coverings. For more information on the hazard, see <u>Blind Cord Safety</u>.

As of December 8, 2023, the company has received no report of incidents or injuries in Canada.

What you should do

Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled products and contact Maxxmar Window Fashions for a repair kit and additional instructions.
